

Help Make Glenbrook Look Its Best! Fix It Stamford, originally known as The Citizen's Service Center, was established in 1996 to serve as a central point for Stamford residents to report issues and request services. As Stamford's Citizen's Service Representative, Huber Lopez personally oversees the online Fix It dashboard, answers phone requests, and makes sure that residents' concerns are addressed by the correct departments.

It's easy to report a problem to Fix It Stamford. Simply go to the city's website at www.stamfordct.gov. At the bottom of the screen you'll see six large buttons. The one with the headset icon will take you directly to the Fix It Stamford Request Form. Fill out the form and it automatically goes to the correct city department to be assigned.

From missed garbage pickup to overgrown vegetation blocking sidewalks, illegal dumping, potholes and more, Fix It Stamford processes about 1000 requests per month. The turnaround time varies.

Some requests—like missed trash pickup—can be

addressed in just a day or two. Others require the city to send a citation to the property owner, which can take longer.

Selecting the proper category for service requests will ensure that your issue is handled promptly. Huber recommends that residents upload a photo of the problem if possible. That will help narrow down the issue for the city personnel assigned to fix it. If you wish, your request can be made anonymously—just don't put in your contact info when prompted. You won't be updated as to the progress, but your request will still go through.

If you have any issues that are not addressed by the form, Huber suggests that you call or email his office directly. His phone number is 203-977-4140 and his email address is Fixlt@StamfordCT.gov. Huber pledges to answer every voicemail and email as quickly as he can. "We can always improve, but I think it's going in the right direction. I want to change the narrative that the government never responds."

#### 2024 Community Micro-Grant Awarded to GNA

If you've walked or driven down Hope Street recently, you may have noticed two beautifully painted traffic signal boxes—each a unique work of art that adds character to our neighborhood.

Thanks to Mayor Caroline Simmons' 2024 Community Micro-Grant Program—awarded to the Glenbrook Neighborhood Association for the third consecutive year—local artists were once again commissioned to transform these everyday structures into vibrant public art.

Artist Sharon Leichsenring created a tribute to Julia A. Stark Elementary School, incorporating the school's logo alongside an inspiring acrostic poem: Students. Thriving. Achieving. Remarkable. Success. See it in front of Westover Pizza II at 306 Hope Street.

Meanwhile, Jean Benoit, known for his stunning contributions to Glenbrook's streetscape over the past three years, painted the box at the corner of Hope Street and Pine Hill Avenue with a breathtaking coastal theme.

# **Tree-mendous News!**

#### A new tree is on the way to Hope Street Park

Professional landscape designer and GNA Member Scott McCauley volunteers many hours each spring and fall to maintain both The Liberty Garden at the Glenbrook Train Station and the plantings in Hope Street Park. In 2018, he arranged to have a Japanese Maple tree donated by the city and planted at Hope Street Park, where it thrived for several years.

Unfortunately, in December of 2023, the Japanese Maple was hit by a car and destroyed. GNA contacted Stamford's Tree Warden who suggested we get a copy of the accident report from the Police Records Dept. and submit it to Stamford's Law Dept. so the city could make an insurance claim.

Thanks to Scott and the dedicated City of Stamford employees who assisted us in this effort, the city received funds for a replacement tree from its insurance company. GNA expects a new tree or flowering bush to be planted in the park this spring.
